

*Acceptable Alternative Student Projects*

1. Create a game for others to play to learn the information.
2. Create a radio or television broadcast or a video production.
3. Write a dairy or journal of an important historical event or person; write a speech a person might have given at the time.
4. Write a song, rap, poem, advertisement, or jingle.
5. Create a travel brochure for another country or planet.
6. Write a script for a play or a mock trial.
7. Write a how-to manual for those who need instruction on how to do or use something.
8. Create a chart or poster to represent synthesis of material.
9. Working with several other learners, create a panel discussion about a topic of a certain historical time period or about how different historical figures might react to a current problem of today.
10. Create an invention to fulfill a personal or social need.
11. Make a model; describe its parts and the functions of each.
12. Survey others; transfer your data to a chart or graph.
